Dear Parents/Guardians,

Thank you to all our families for beginning the school year with us! In these challenging times, our goal is to provide your child with as much support and continuity in their education as possible. Since the first Executive Order in March that closed all schools, we have learned to adapt, persevere, sacrifice and navigate the ever-changing dynamics of life during a pandemic.

On July 28, 2020, Pima County issued a statement to school districts that included recommendations from Chief Medical Officer Dr. Francisco Garcia and Public Health Director Dr. Teresa Cullen with guidance that stated that the earliest in-person instruction could safely be anticipated to resume would be after Labor Day, September 7, 2020 or later. Furthermore, on Thursday, August 6, 2020, under the direction of an Executive Order by Governor Ducey, the Arizona Department of Health (ADHS) released public health benchmarks that are intended to guide the safe return to in-person instruction.

Based on the benchmarks set by ADHS for in-person instruction, in-person instruction will not be able to resume on August 17<sup>th</sup> as originally planned. The good news is that the benchmarks are trending in the right direction.

My recommendation to the School Board is that we follow the public health data provided by ADHS and Pima County Health in determining when it is reasonably safe to resume in-person instruction. Based on the data, in-person instruction will most likely not take place until after Labor Day or later.

The School Governing Board will be meeting the week of August 10<sup>th</sup> to review the ADHS benchmarks and review adjustments to instructional options that may need to be put in place in order to reopen schools to provide in-person instruction. In addition, the School Governing Board will review and approve the required Mitigation Policy that outlines the instructional plans. Once the Mitigation Policy is approved, it will be posted on the school's website.

We recognize that COVID-19 is creating challenges beyond just the physical safe return to school. The social, emotional, and academic well-being of our students is of utmost importance to us. As per the Executive Order (2020-51) the school building will be open to those students who require a safe haven beginning August 17<sup>th</sup> however, schools are not required to provide all available services to every student who express any particular need and can implement scheduling and utilization mechanisms to allow them to plan for anticipated on-site capacity on any given day. You must call the school to reserve a spot the week prior and the school will be able to give more details about scheduling. This will not be in-person instruction, students will be doing their Distance Learning on their chromebooks with a monitor. **Students will be socially distanced. Students will be required to wear masks at all times. Students will be assigned a seat that they will remain in for the day, with bathroom and short breaks.** We are required to comply with these restrictions.

Operating in a pandemic is historic and unfamiliar for all of us. We will continue to adapt, persevere, sacrifice and offer grace. Perhaps these are the most important lessons presented to all of us this year!
